



# SOUTH EAST ASIA

The **Sustainable Consumption and Production Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines** (SCP TIP) project aims to improve capacity to integrate SCP principles in politics, private businesses and civil society as a means for living up to national climate strategies. It is connected to the One Planet Network Sustainable Food Systems Programme and runs for three years.

The **Thai** component of the project applies a market-based approach developing sustainable agriculture models in Nan and Chiang Mai provinces, with 1100 farming families and a total area of 500 hectares involved. In combination with a partnering large retailer in the region (Central Group) sustainable value chains are being established.

**Indonesia** is focused on comprehensive “Better Consumption” (Beli Yang Baik), combined with private business engagement. As an example, in the sustainable palm oil sector private businesses along the value chain (producers, brand owners, retailers) are brought together in sustainability partnerships (e.g. in a roundtable, voluntary agreements, discussion rounds, etc.).

The **Philippine** component is titled “The Sustainable Diner” and is partnering with restaurants to provide healthier and more environmentally-friendly food options. Restaurants integrate local and natural ingredients to create healthy dishes, minimize single-use plastics, and reduce food waste. Participating restaurants are incorporating sustainability into their long-term goals, training their staff and providing consumers with sustainable dining options.

Through the whole campaign, multi-sectoral awareness on the environmental impacts of the food service industry is created, and ways to reduce this footprint are demonstrated, across South East Asia
